

**Marshal's Report**  
**September 14 - October 19, 2006**

September 15, 2006 3:01 am. The deputy on duty took a theft report from a construction contractor working on a home in the Albion Basin. The report included the theft of several construction tools. This case is still under investigation.

September 16, 2006 The snowfall Alta received had the so called "Jibbers" crawling out of the woodwork. This kept the cops on there toes trying to keep them off of buildings, railings and dragging picnic tables and such off and out on to the mountain.

September 19, 2006 2:26 pm. Alta Marshal's and UFA were dispatched to a residence on the By-Pass Road to remedy a smoldering electric hot water heater.

September 22, 2006 8:52 am. The Marshal's and UFA responded to a medical emergency at a residence on Martha Road. The patient was transported to the hospital by ambulance. 4:00 pm. The young recreation enthusiasts were given trespass warnings and lectures. 10:42 pm the deputy was once again giving out warnings and lectures to Jibbers trespassing on the church railings.

September 26, 2006 4:00 pm. a woman called to report that she had lost her Kodak digital camera when it flew off the roof of her car.

September 29, 2006 7:00 pm. The Marshal's Office investigated a report of a gun shot in the Emma Ridge area. Contact was made with a misinformed hunter.

September 30, 2006 12:17 am. The Alta deputy assisted County Sheriff with a vehicle roll-over near the Tanner's Campground. 7:52 pm. the deputy again assisted with a motorcycle crash in the mid-canyon.

October 2, 2006 3:34 pm. the deputy on duty assisted with a crash involving a Pepsi delivery truck that turned over trying to avoid a motorist parked on a blind corner enjoying the beautiful fall colors. No injuries were reported.

October 17, & 18, 2006 With the change in weather and new snow to slide on, the Jibbers returned to Alta in full force. One group I made contact with had brought their own picnic table to jump on while another individual who had shoveled a large amount of snow on to the church steps and deck so he could slide down the railings. He was informed that people were paid to remove the snow and that it would be a good idea for him to clean up the mess and leave.
