

Marshal's Report September 12-October 11, 2007

The Marshal's Office has reluctantly entered a different era with the retirement of Town Marshal Jerry Larson and Dispatcher Anne Crowley. Our longtime friends have relocated to Washington State where they are completing construction on their home. We all want to thank them for their years of service to this community and friendship. - **September 12th 12:04 p.m. - A minor traffic accident was investigated on the Bypass Road.**
- **September 15th 8:19 a.m. - A man was cited for having an unlicensed dog in a watershed area in Albion Basin.**
- **September 18th 9:49 a.m. - A woman taking part in an inspection of avalanche control equipment suffered a sudden collapse on Peruvian Ridge. CPR was administered and a medical helicopter was summoned to the scene. The woman unfortunately did not survive. The Marshal's Office is awaiting a final report from the State Medical Examiner's Office.**
- **September 22nd 9:04 p.m. - The Marshal's Office assisted the County Sheriff with an assault at one of the Snowbird Lodges. A male was arrested for his part in the dispute.**
- **September 23rd 2:48 p.m. - A report was taken of mountain bikers jumping from a structure on private property.**
- **September 27th 9:14 p.m. - A report was taken regarding threats against property. This appears to be an ongoing domestic issue and is under investigation.**
- **September 28th 10:30 p.m. - A traffic stop for speeding evolved into a trip to the county jail and vehicle impound for a man with multiple arrest warrants.**
- **October 1st 7:49- A theft from a construction site was reported. A significant amount of copper wire and tools were stolen from a contractor.**
- **October 2nd 12:00 p.m. - The Marshal's and Sheriff's Departments provided traffic control for the airlift of concrete over the State Highway. New avalanche control equipment is being installed in the Superior area by the Department of Transportation.**
- **October 5th- The Deputy on Duty discovered an act of vandalism in the Albion Basin Campground. With the early snow, came the first wave of what we have previously dubbed "The Jibbers". They are collectively, the enthusiasts who are willing to ride skis, snowboard, trashcan lids, disassembled picnic tables etc. down and over anything with an inch of snow on it. The jibbing season typically comes with several trespassing, littering, and conduct complaints, not to mention medical emergencies. Please contact us if you observe destructive acts.**
