

MARSHAL'S REPORT
December 13, 2007-January 12, 2008

- **December 13th, 7:19 pm-** The Deputy on duty investigated a possible fraud/misuse of a credit card at one of the local lodges.
- **December 15th, 11:25 am-** The Marshal's and Fire Departments responded to a backcountry skier having difficulty breathing in the Flagstaff area. The man was transported to a hospital via ambulance. At 3:54 pm, a call was received of a reckless and possibly intoxicated driver in the Tanners Flat area of the canyon. Immediately after the call was received, the vehicle rolled and the female driver was seriously injured. The driver was flown by medical helicopter to a local hospital. At 5:15 pm, the Marshal was flagged down on the highway by a man trying to transport a snowboarder with a head injury. Another ambulance and fire crew were summoned to attend to the injured person.
- **December 17th, 7:18 am-** The Superior/Hellgate section of the highway was closed and Interlodge put into effect for firing of avalanche control weapons.
- **December 20th, 6:45 am-** The canyon highway was closed and Interlodge was put into effect for avalanche control work. At 10:47 am, the deputy on duty mediated a civil dispute at a bypass road construction site. At 2:46 pm, the Superior/Hellgate area was placed on Interlodge due to increasing avalanche hazard. At 8:59 pm, a minor traffic accident was investigated on the bypass road.
- **December 21st, 6:45 am-** The highway was restricted and Interlodge put into effect for avalanche control work. At 3:15 pm, another traffic accident was investigated on the bypass road.
- **December 22nd 7:25 am-** Traffic on the Bypass Road was restricted for avalanche control work.
- **December 23rd 9:23 am-** The deputy on duty responded to one of the lodges to keep the peace as an employee was terminated. At 3:16 pm a traffic accident was investigated near the Rustler Lodge. At 4:27 pm, the Marshal's office assisted with a rollover accident in the Snowbird Entry 3 area.
- **December 24th 10:00 pm-** Hellgate/Superior was placed on interlodge due to increasing avalanche danger. At 11:16 pm, the deputy on duty assisted an unruly patron from the Peruvian Lodge at the Managements request.
- **December 25th 6:45 am-** The Town of Alta was placed on interlodge until 8:25am for avalanche control work.
- **December 26th 8:39 am-** The Unified Fire Authority responded to the Snowpine Lodge on a possible spinal injury. At 8:54 pm, a missing person report was taken. The Alta Central Dispatcher was able to verify the person's well being by following their bar tab as it progressed down the canyon until they were located.

- **December 27th 4:30 am-** The Fire Department responded to a sick person at the Goldminer's Daughter Lodge. At 9:20 am, a traffic accident was investigated in the Alta Peruvian Lodge parking lot.
- **December 28th 1:00 pm-** A man was cited for theft of services after being caught skiing on someone else's season pass. At 2:21 pm, a traffic accident was investigated in the Wildcat parking lot.
- **December 29th 3:10 pm-** The Marshal responded to assist the Ski Patrol with a disorderly patron at the Wildcat Base area. The man who suffered from a multitude of mental health, substance abuse, and other disorders was released to the custody of a family member after cooling off for awhile in handcuffs. After the man left the canyon, a theft report was received concerning the pair of ski boots he was wearing. At 10:18 pm, the Marshal's and Fire Departments responded to the Blackjack Condominiums after a woman had fallen and sustained head injuries. She was transported to the hospital via ambulance. At 10:57 pm, an alert caller phoned in a hit and run accident he had witnessed in the Wildcat parking lot. A very good description of the suspect vehicle led to the driver being caught in the mid-canyon. The driver was charged with leaving the scene of an accident.
- **December 30th 6:45am-** The canyon road was closed and interlodge placed into effect for avalanche control. The mid-canyon was closed again for control work at 11:19 am.
- **December 31st 6:45am-** Another canyon closure and interlodge occurred for avalanche control work. At 11:35 pm, the Marshal's and Fire Departments responded to a Bypass Road residence for a small electrical fire.
- **January 1st 11:01 am-** The Marshal's Office was called to the Albion Day Lodge to stand by while management terminated an employee and sent him D.T.C. (DOWN THE CANYON!) Unfortunately, the young man continued to direct attention to himself in the ski area and was assisted to the medical clinic by ski patrol after being found in a semi-responsive state and suffering from cold injuries. The man then fled from the clinic and was intercepted running for the highway. Ultimately, he was transported via ambulance under doctor's orders to undergo a mental health assessment. At 2:32 pm, the Marshal's Office assisted the County Sheriff with a rollover accident in the lower canyon. At 4:25 pm, a traffic accident was investigated in the Wildcat parking lot.
- **January 2nd 1046 am-** A small fire in a dumpster outside the Rustler lodge was responded to by the Fire and Marshal's departments. At 12:21 pm, a traffic accident was investigated near the Shallow Shaft Restaurant.
- **January 5th 1205 am-** A residential alarm was investigated at a bypass residence. At 4:00 am, the Superior/Hellgate area was placed on interlodge. A canyon closure and interlodge followed at 7:00 am and avalanche control work was conducted.
- **January 6th 11:54 am-** The mid-canyon area was closed for avalanche control and was reopened at 2:45 pm.

- **January 7th 6:30 am-** The canyon was again closed and interlodge put into effect for avalanche control. A male was arrested for violating interlodge restrictions in the ski area.
- **January 8th 3:00 pm-** Our friend from December 29th was arrested in Pinedale, Wyoming. The missing ski boots were recovered and returned to their owner.
- **January 9th 1:07 am-**The Marshal's, Fire, and Sheriff's Departments responded to the Peruvian Lodge for a man experiencing some type of mental health issue and behaving in a threatening manner. After some negotiation and some calming solution administered by Paramedics, the man agreed to an ambulance ride and evaluation at a local hospital. At 7:18 am, an avalanche released across the highway in the Little Pine area prompting an road closure and search for possible trapped vehicles. Fortunately, no one was trapped in the slide and crews were able to proceed with avalanche control and snow removal to reopen the highway, which was accomplished at 10:15 am.
- **January 10th 7:00 am-** The canyon highway was restricted and interlodge put into effect until 8:40 am for avalanche control.
